

CURRICULUM NEWS FOR THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY


Year 4 Summer Term



English

This term the children will be studying books written by the author and illustrator Anthony Browne.. In Voices in the Park they will explore the story of a visit to the park from the point of view of four different characters. They will learn how authors use text and illustrations to show the moods of their

characters and through drama and role play they will explore the relationships between them. The book will be a stimulus for the children to write character descriptions, diary entries and letters offering advice.



During the second half of the term children will be studying another Book by Anthony Browne: **Zoo.**Again, they will use drama and role play to help them write diary entries and play scripts relating to the book. The children will then move on to non fiction writing researching different endangered animals from the text. They will write letters and leaflets persuading readers to care for and protect the endangered animals



Maths

This term we will continue to work on place value. We will look at comparing and ordering thousands, hundreds, tens and units and tenths and hundredths, relating decimal notation to money. Then we will study the columnar methods of addition and subtraction. While working on subtraction we will discover how the exchange of tens for ones, hundreds for tens, and thousands for hundreds help complete the task. Children will be learning how to calculate mathematical statements for multiplication using 11 and 12 times tables and learning the formal written methods of multiplication and division.

As well as number, children will be be working on time, shape and measures. Children will identify and describe the properties of **3D** shapes as well as identifying **2D** shapes on the surface of **3D** shapes. Also children will describe the positions on a 2D grid of co-ordinates in the first quadrant.

In addition, children will continue to tell the **Time** using 24 hour clocks, and use simple charts to solve time problems. Children will also be learning how to read and interpret bar charts and line graphs.

Finally, children will be revising last terms work on area and perimeter and using their knowledge to solve practical problems. They will be revisiting the relationship between different unit of measurement. For example 10mm=1cm 100cm = 1m and 1000g=1kg and 1000ml= 1L



During the first half term, children will be learning about *Sound*. They will learn how sounds are made and that sounds travel through solids, liquids and gases. Children will also investigate how well sound travels through different materials and discover how instruments make sounds. They will also suggest how to change the pitch and loudness.

Our last Science topic for year 4 will be Living Things and Their Habitats. Through discussion and investigation we will discover what an organism is and where they live. We will find out how different climates, other plant life and environmental changes affect the life style and evolution of plants and animals. The children will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.

We will work on Food Chains. The children will show what they know about living things and how they obtain energy by drawing food chains with themselves as the last "link". We shall develop this idea by looking at a wide range of animals, finding their location in a food web or chain and categorising them as producers, consumers, predators, prey, herbivores or carnivores.


Art and Design

This term we are incorporating our art into our project work, and asking the children to bear in mind line, shape, pattern and texture. The use of different media will be suggested and a range of ideas encouraged.

In Art children will be designing Ancient Greek vases in the style of red and black figure pottery. They will also be modelling pots based on Ancient Greek designs.

The visiting artist will be spending a day in each class creating a piece of art linked to the English topic on endangered animals.







History

This term children will be learning about the civilization of Ancient Greece. They will be locating Greece on a map and placing Ancient Greece on a timeline. Children will discover why sailing and trade were important and contributed to the wealth of cities like Athens. They will find out about the birth of democracy in Athens, and contrast with the way of life in military Sparta. They will be learning about Ancient Greek gods and goddesses and what the Greeks believed happened after people died. They will be researching everyday life for ordinary families and slaves in the Greek cities. Finally, they will be discovering the origin of the Olympic Games and finding out about the Ancient Greek theatre.

I.C.T.

The emphasis in I.C.T. this term will be on Multimedia (Video) and databasing.

For databasing, children will use information to produce a database. For their science topic, the children will be extracting information from the internet and DVDs on


living things and their habitats. They will then produce their own graphs, fact sheets, tree diagram and food chains and use this data for sorting their images and creating questions. Children will be shown the data basing tool and will learn to import images into the databases.

Children will work through the process to create questions which can be split into two groups.

For Multimedia, Children will be shown how to record using cameras and to edit their films using Macbook.
