


CURRICULUM NEWS FOR YEAR 1

Issued Termly Autumn 2018 September 2018—December 2018



Writing

The children will start their year one English lessons reading and exploring 'Cave Baby' by famous author Julia Donaldson. In the story, a hairy

mammoth takes a cheeky little baby on a thrilling ride through a moonlit landscape populated by a sabre-toothed tiger, a leaping hare, a laughing hyena and even, just maybe, a big brown bear...

Both classes will spend time retelling the story with puppets and in small world. The will begin to write simple sentences and build towards retelling the story and writing letters.

Just like in Reception the children will be working on a range of activities through the week, some independent and others supported by an adult.

Later in the term, the children will build upon their writing skills working with a variety of books including: The Odd

Egg, Pig the Pug, Yeti and the Bird as well as Lost and Found. All children will experience writing a range of fiction



and non-fiction: reports, diaries, let-

more!



The main focus of their writing throughout the Autumn term will be constructing

simple sentences with appropriate finger spaces and correct usage of capital letters and full stops. They will

begin to explore using conjunctions to form longer sentences in addition to looking at exclamation marks and questions marks to end sentences.



Reading

At school, children read twice weekly with an adult and with their teacher as part of their Shared Reading sessions. This reading will support their learning, however, the biggest impact for your child will be reading every day at home with YOU! Spending ten to fif-I teen minutes per day reading with your child, asking questions and discussing the text, is essential as this will help improve their ability to decode and answer comprehension questions, which is a vital skill for future learning across the whole curriculum.

Year 1

will take home a reading book matched to their reading ability in addition to a school library book which they can choose themselves.

The children will also get library books. We will let you know when this starts.

Science

In the first half of the Autumn term, year 1 will be learning all about animals, including humans. Both classes will be studying animals, their diets and the difference between mammals, birds, fish and reptiles. They will be looking at young animals and how they grow into adult animals. They will also be studying how to look after and care for a range of household pets.

Moving into Autumn 2, Blue and Yellow class will be looking at the names of



various parts of the human body and the bodies of animals. They will also be exploring and investigating their senses as well as learning how to stay fit,

live healthier lives, the importance of keeping clean with particular focus on brushing and caring for their teeth.



Maths

In the first half of the Autumn term, both classes will be learning more about numbers, addition, subtraction, 2D shapes and place value.



In Autumn 2, all children will explore length and height, multiplication, division, measurement and time, addition and subtraction and both 2D and 3D shapes .

Here are a few suggestions of things to practise at home to help your child to improve their mathematical skills:

- 1) Writing digits correctly, moving the pencil in the correct direction ensuring the digit is facing the correct way.
- 2) Counting forwards and back to and from 20, using objects and fingers.
 - Adding and subtracting numbers to 20.
 - Number bonds to 10 (1+9, 2+8 etc)
- 5) 1 more and less / 10 more and 10 less than a given number

Please remember maths is everywhere, not just in the classroom or at a desk! Talk about maths and numbers wherever you are.

When you're out and about, try these questions:

How many cars are on the road? How many would there be if one more came/ one drove away?

What number do you see on the door? Can you spot what the door numbers are going up in? Is there a pattern?

How many people are in front in the queue? How many people including us?

How many apples are in the basket? How many would there be if I ate one?

FOUNDATION SUBJECTS

Religious Education



In the first half term, the children will be learning about God's Great Plan. During this topic, they will be learning the creation story from the Bible and retelling what God made on each of the seven days.

They will spend time exploring the tale of Noah's Ark which will lead into discussing the wonderful world God made for us and how we can best look after it.

Moving into the second part of the first term, both classes will spend a week learning about a different faith: Judaism.



After this week, the children will start their second topic: Mary, Mother of God. Working in groups, the children will be looking at Mary and all her qualities. They will explore and retell Bible stories about Mary with a focus on the Christmas story during Advent.

Humanities



During the Autumn term, the children will be looking at the location of hot and cold areas of the world. They will relate this to the position of the Equator and the North and South Poles. This will

be linked to the books explored in their English lessons and their learning about animals in Science.


Computing

In Computing during the first half term, the children will be acquiring basic, key skills using the desktop computers in the Computing Suite. They will focus on familiarising themselves with a keyboard,

learning to type with increasing speed and using common programmes such as 'Word'.



The children will learn about e-safety. They will be learning about how to keep safe when using the internet and all electronic media, such as i-Pads and smart



During the second half of the term, year 1 will continue to use the Computing Suite to access a website called Code. This child

friendly programme will support the children to work independently whilst learning the foundations of code. They will be selecting from and inputting a set of code to animate and move a character.

Homework

Weekly homework, will be sent home on Thursdays and is due in the following Tuesday.

Homework will be about the children's learning for that week. The homework is designed to be completed with adult support.

Please ensure you work with your child on their learning.

The year 1 Music lessons will be taught by specialist music teacher Mr Wells. He will cover a range of key skills exploring rhythm, beat and pitch.



He will then be teaching the children to play the recorder. They will learn a variety of songs including some carols leading up to the Christmas Nativity.

The children take part in a Singing Assembly once a week where they learn a range of hymns and songs.

Physical Education

In year 1, each week the children will take part in 2 P.E. lessons: one inside and one outside.



Whilst working inside, the children will be working on floor movements: skipping, rolling, jumping, hopping and so on. They practise balancing in a range of positions and then piece their balances and move-

ments together to create simple sequences individually, in pairs and as a group.

During outdoor P.E, the children will be completing target games. The children will use a range of equipment, such as small and large softballs, beanbags and quoits to build their skills in throwing with accuracy. The unit will focus

on teaching key skills such as keeping your head up, eyes on the target, both overarm and underarm throws in addition to spread-



ing your fingers and standing in the correct position. The children will build upon these skills each week through a range of engaging and enjoyable activities whilst building on their ability to take turns, share equipment, co-operate, support their peers and work within a team.

<u>Correct P.E. kit must be</u> worn for all lessons.



Art

During the Autumn term, the children will be creating their own cave paintings and pictures animals through mark making, drawing and painting. The will use a range of media such as pencil, chalk, pastels and paint. The children will be given opportunities to share their ideas, experiences and imagination through their work. They will be taught a wide range of techniques in using colour, pat-

tern, line and shape. They will also be creating work for the school art exhibition which will be held on Tuesday 20th November.
