


Gospgl: Mark 4:35-41

On the evening of that same day Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go across to the other side of the lake."

So they left the crowd; the disciples got into the boat in which Jesus was already sitting, and they took him with them. Other boats were there too. Suddenly a strong wind blew up, and the waves began to spill over into the boat, so that it was about to fill with water. Jesus was in the back of the boat, sleeping with his head on a pillow. The disciples woke him up and said, "Teacher, don't you care that we are about to die?"



Gospel: Mark 4:35-41





What do you remember from today's reading?




Jesus was in a boat with his disciples, when the wind started to blow really strongly. And the waves started crashing against the boat. They were so high that the boat almost sank.

How do you think you would have felt if you were on this boat?




What was Jesus doing while all this was happening? Was he afraid?

If you had been one of the disciples on that boat, with the wind blowing and the waves crashing, do you think you would have trusted Jesus that everything would be ok?

Sometimes when everything around us is scary and going wrong, it can be hard to keep our faith in God. We can feel like God is no longer with us and it is hard to see how things will get better.

But in this reading Jesus tells the disciples not to be afraid. They should know that God is always with them, especially in the difficult times.


God works through us and through others who are there to help and support us in the difficult times.
