
The Feast of All Saints

Saints are good men and women who followed God and have now died. Some of the saints could heal and some could work miracles.






Saints are holy, but they are not freaks or exceptions. They are human beings like you and I.


The Feast of All Saints


On the feast of All Saints the Church celebrates all these human beings who during their lives loved God and neighbour and after death now share in God's divine life in heaven.

St Veronica



We hear the story of Veronica when we pray the Stations of the Cross. At the Sixth Station, Jesus stopped to allow Veronica to wipe the blood, sweat, and dirt from his face. This simple act of kindness is all we know about Veronica, a woman in Jerusalem. She is not mentioned in the Gospels, but Jesus' followers must have shared the story of her loving care for the Lord so often that it has become part of our tradition.

It is believed that Veronica used her veil to wipe Jesus' face. Afterward, the image of Jesus' face was imprinted on the cloth.

Saint Michael is viewed as the commander of the <u>Army of God</u>. From the time of the apostles, he has been honored as the protector of the Church.
